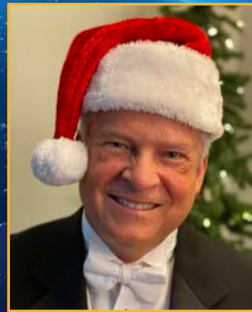

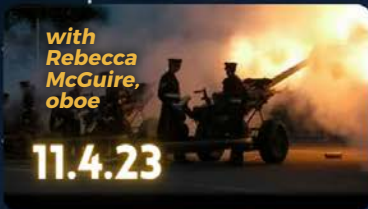


PETERSEN PLAYS GRIEG

David Bowden is passionate about sharing the joy of making music with young people through this program.

Prepare to be dazzled, awed, and inspired by tonight's music performed by a **remarkable orchestra** as we celebrate one of nature's most **exquisite sights**.

David Bowden has served as Artistic Director & Conductor of the Terre Haute Symphony Orchestra since 1997. During his years

of leadership, the THSO has seen significant growth artistically and continues to provide exciting accessible concerts. David's charismatic energy and special gift of bringing music to life result in performances that have unusual spirit, dramatic power and vitality.

Born and raised in North Carolina, David has loved music since he was a very young child. He grew up listening to his mother teaching piano lessons in their home. At the age of four, he talked her into teaching him piano. In addition to the piano, he has played clarinet, oboe, percussion, and organ.

David enjoys performing a wide variety of repertoire – from opera to symphonic standards to pops and country music. He especially enjoys educational concerts for schools, hoping to inspire children to choose to learn to play an instrument, believing that *making music changes lives*.

Majoring in piano performance with a minor in organ at Wheaton College Conservatory of Music, David has a particular love for orchestral music that features piano and organ. Recordings of his concerts have been broadcast nationwide on American Public Media's *Performance Today* and *Pipedreams* as well as NPR's *With Heart & Voice*. His commercial recording of Marcel Dupré's *Complete Music for Organ and Orchestra* (Naxos) received rave international reviews. He has also received five ASCAP awards for programming.

While a student at Wheaton, David met his wife, Donna, a registered nurse, during an intramural volleyball game. Graduate school took them to Bloomington, where David received his M.M. in Choral Conducting at Indiana University. After teaching in the college setting, David returned to IU and earned a Doctor of Music in Orchestral Conducting.

After serving for 35 years as the Founding Artistic Director and Conductor of the Columbus Indiana Philharmonic and the Philharmonic Chorus, he recently retired from those positions and has been named Conductor Laureate of the Philharmonic. He also served as Artistic Director of the Carmel Symphony Orchestra from 1999 to 2016.

He is a member of the Pi Kappa Lambda National Music Honor Society and has been listed in *Who's Who in America* and *Who's Who in the World* for the past two decades. He has served as a member of the Board of Directors of the International Conductors Guild, a global service and music advocacy organization for conductors. He also served as Director of the Guild's *New Music Project* for almost two decades.

David is a proud recipient of the prestigious *Sagamore of the Wabash* award presented by the Governor of Indiana.

David loves basketball, football, and tennis and enjoys reading and spending time with his family, including his 5 grandchildren.

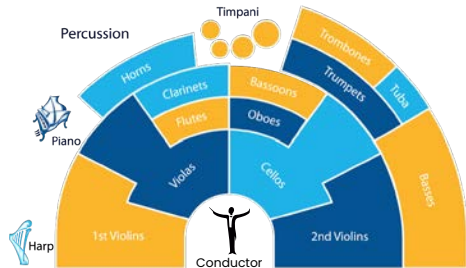

OF THE HAUTE



A total solar eclipse transcends scientific explanation. It is a gentle, yet powerful reminder of our place in the universe. For centuries the event has evoked wonder, fascination and oftentimes fear in mankind.

In less than 48 hours, the Wabash Valley will be the epicenter and play host to this celestial wonder. We are ready. All eyes will be on us and our eyes will all be tilted toward the sky - with safety glasses of course - accompanied by a childlike look of wonder.

This extraordinary event is a celestial choreographed dance party that brings together the Sun, the Moon, and the Earth falling into perfect alignment. As the moon's shadow slowly meanders across the Sun, it creates a profound shift in the ambiance. The sky darkens, the streetlights respond, the temperature drops and for all of us that are fortunate enough to be here (at the right place and the right time) the Total Solar Eclipse becomes the star attraction. We see the same drama that man has seen, with wonder, for centuries. The last Total Solar Eclipse visible in Terre Haute was in 1869. The next time Terre Haute is in the path of totality is 2153. It is indeed a once in a lifetime event.

Tonight, our own Terre Haute Symphony Orchestra (a shining star in itself) will regale us with *Music of the Heavens* complete with visuals that will take us beyond the stars.

ROGER KALIA

THSO ARTISTIC DIRECTOR-DESIGNATE



Dr. Roger Kalia has recently been appointed Artistic Director-Designate for the Terre Haute Symphony and joins Dr. David Bowden in conducting tonight's concert. Kalia will assume the role of Artistic Director for the 2025-26 Season following Dr. Bowden's retirement in June of 2025. Roger is not unknown to the musicians and audiences of Terre Haute - he was selected to conduct the THSO when David had a family conflict arise in 2022. He made an immediate connection with the musicians, members of the Board of Directors, and the audience with his musicality and natural charisma.

A native of New York State, Dr. Roger Kalia holds degrees from Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, the University of Houston, and SUNY Potsdam's Crane School of Music. Roger is currently the Music Director of the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra (Evansville, IN), Symphony New Hampshire (NH), and Orchestra Santa Monica (CA). He is also Co-Founder and Music Director of the Lake George Music Festival in upstate New York. The 2024-25 season will complete his contract with Symphony New Hampshire.

Roger has guest conducted many orchestras across the United States, including the National Symphony Orchestra at the Kennedy Center, Chicago Sinfonietta, Louisiana Philharmonic, Hollywood Chamber Orchestra, Baltimore Chamber Orchestra, and the Long Beach Symphony among many others.

"I had a great experience with the THSO when I stepped in to conduct a concert with the orchestra in November 2022. As Artistic Director-Designate, I am excited to work with the musicians and Board of Directors to lead this orchestra into a new chapter while continuing the tradition of excellence established by David Bowden."

Kalia is married to musicologist/violinist Dr. Christine Wisch. They enjoy traveling and life with their Coton de Tulear, Burney, named after the music historian Charles Burney.

JOSÉ FRANCISCO SALGADO

José Francisco Salgado, is an Emmy-nominated astronomer (BS in Physics, Univ. of Puerto Rico; PhD in Astronomy, Univ. of Michigan), experimental photographer, visual artist, and public speaker who creates multimedia works that communicate science in engaging ways.



As the Executive Director and co-founder of KV 265, a non-profit science and arts education organization, Dr. Salgado collaborates with orchestras, composers, and musicians to present films that provoke curiosity and a sense of wonder about the Earth and the Universe.

His Science & Symphony films have been presented in 260 concerts and 215 lectures reaching a combined audience of more than 480,000 people in 21 countries. Orchestras that have presented these works include the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Boston Pops, the San Francisco Symphony, New World Symphony, and the Orchestra Teatro Regio Torino.

In 2012, his film "Gustav Holst's The Planets" was chosen for Ravinia Festival's One Score, One Chicago initiative. In 2014, his collaboration with composer Christopher Theofanidis, "The Legend of the Northern Lights" was premiered with Grant Park Orchestra and seen by over 32,000 people. In 2016, his short film "Carol of the Lights" was commissioned by Keith Lockhart and Boston Pops and presented 33 times to almost 75,000 people.

From 2006 - 2008 Dr. Salgado hosted "Nuestra Galaxia," a weekly astronomy news segment on Univision Chicago (WGBO) for which he received an Emmy nomination.

As an experimental photographer, Salgado has visited more than 30 scientific sites in remote places including the Atacama Desert, the French Pyrenees, and the South African Karoo, and has contributed visuals to documentaries produced for the History, Discovery, BBC, and National Geographic channels. He has also served as contributing writer for Digital Photography Review (DPReview.com). As a public speaker, he has given lectures on all seven continents, including a presentation at the Amundsen-Scott South Pole Station.

Dr. Salgado's work with KV 265 has been supported by the National Endowment for the Arts and the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation. Four of his Science & Symphony films have been recognized by UNESCO for their educational value.

The Terre Haute Symphony is honored that Dr. Salgado has chosen to participate in person by providing the video and photos shown during tonight's concert experience.
